AFGHANI WOMEN-HEADED HOUSEHOLDS

After a request from Alison Battisson, Human Rights for All it was agreed that NCW NSW would consider being a Proposing Organisation for a small number of these refugees. Alison had been one of our Celebrate Being an Australian Awardees a number of years ago and had also assisted us with informal interpreter services when we had international delegations.

The Initial request was to do it for one family however, when presented with a list of eight families – all had been living in the same guest house – we decided to do it for all eight families. They had all been living in Pakistan since they escaped Kabul following the takeover by the Taliban.

The first of the families arrived in April 2023. On arrival in Australia they are met at the airport by Settlement Services International (SSI) staff, transported to their short term, fully furnished accommodation, SSI arrange for a week's worth of pantry/cold storage items and within a day or two will also take them to open a bank account, Centrelink, Medicare and introduce them to the health services, enrol children in schools and adults are enrolled in TAFE for English lessons (where needed).



The first question the young girl in this photograph asked, 'When can I start school?' – straight after getting off a journey that had taken over 24 hours since she left Pakistan.→

A number of the adults are already employed – one as an animator at Moore Park, Sydney and one of the young men has been employed by Good Guys, Penrith.



We are so pleased to have been able to be part of a solution to provide safety to these families and wish them long and happy lives in Australia. We look forward to attending their citizenship ceremonies in future years.

Wesley Mission was the first to deliver gambling counselling services in Australia, and previous generations of leaders have been committed to this cause – it is in our DNA and now is the time for change.”

Keeping Women Out Of Prison Coalition (KWOOP)

Improving outcomes for women & children affected by the NSW criminal justice system.

KWOOP is an independent, authoritative voice advocating evidence based support, and is a sub-fund of the Sydney Community Foundation.

Its purpose is to influence NSW systems, policy and practice in order to reduce the number of women in prison and to minimise the impacts on their families and children.

Snapshot – Women in prisons across New South Wales

- 833 women in prison (as at March 2022).
- The number of women in NSW prisons increased by 29% between 2015 and 2018, peaking at 1,067 and then declining slightly - a similar trajectory to other Australian prison populations, with marked decrease from 2020 due to policy settings stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic.
- 45% of women were being held on remand.
- 37.5% of women in custody were Aboriginal, compared to 3.4% in the wider population.
- 64% of women entering prison were mothers.
- Almost 24% of women in prison grew up in care and 14% said their parents had been in care as children.
- 13% of the children of prisoners are in state care, including out-of-home care.
- The cost of keeping a person in custody for a year in NSW (\$139,809) is 29 times higher than it costs for that person to receive a community-based sentence instead (\$4,883).



KWOOP coalition includes: The Sydney Community Foundation through its KWOOP Fund, By My Side Fund and Sydney Women's Fund, SHINE for Kids, Community Restorative Centre (CRC) through The Miranda Project, Women's Justice Network, Zonta Club of Sydney, Australian Centre for Public and Population Health Research UTS, Corrective Services NSW, Dress for Success Sydney, UNSW School of Social Sciences, Kathleen York House, Deadly Connections Inc, Soroptimists NSW, National Council of Women NSW, and the Country Women's Association NSW and individuals – philanthropists, researchers and others committed to being part of a solution.

President of National Council of Women of NSW Inc, Julie Morris attended many Zoom sessions and a number of face-to-face meetings. The revitalisation of this project after the COVID19 pandemic is welcomed. We honour too the late Rosalind (Ros) Maybanke Strong AM – a 'driver' and superb leader of KWOOP, until her passing in March 2023 and particular condolences to her colleagues at Zonta Club of Sydney who greatly miss her wisdom, friendship and brightness.
